SRCDC Strategic Aims:

- **5.** We aim to build a sense of tolerance, understanding and appreciation between different ethnic and cultural groups in the community.
- **6.** To support sustainability of our work and growth by identifying and pursuing a wide range of funding opportunities that support our strategic principles.
- 7. To be accountable to community members via the Board and in other ways. To hold regular consultation events to enable us to be clear about the main needs of the community and the extent to which we are perceived as meeting those needs.



An exciting new project, working with local community members with lived experience of migration. The aim is to foster a long-term relationship between the organisations and the community it serves, with the ultimate aim of influencing National Policy.

Let's Interpret

Let's Interpret is a group of female community interpreters based in Cardiff. The group came into being following an "First Steps to Public Service Interpreting" course that was delivered via Cardiff University's "Live Local, Learn Local" outreach programme in partnership with South Riverside Community Development Centre's "Believe/Credu" project (which works with women over 25 years of age, from a BAME background, with caring and/or childcare responsibilities).

Community Engagement Open Days

Providing Information, recruiting volunteers and listening to our community's needs.

Wyndham Street Centre

Community membership scheme run by community members. Providing quality foodstuffs from FareShare Cymry. During the pandemic delivered 100 food parcels a week to local families.

Development of a Food Pantry

For the community, run by volunteers, providing quality foodstuffs at rock bottom prices.

Believe/Credu Project

Supporting women over 25 into training and employment. Peer support, Dedicated Courses, Volunteering, Bl Courses, Self-employment and Social Enterprise.

Youth Club

Provides open access youth services in Riverside and Grangetown.

The River (Music project)

Bringing together cross cultural music from the many different music forms, instruments and musicians across the diverse and various communities of Riverside.

Greening and Growing

Supporting local residents, with equipment, plants, seeds and infrastructure to increase edible growing and create an urban meadow in South Riverside.

Action in Caerau and Ely, Cardiff Salad Garden, Food Cardiff, Grow Cardiff, Pedal Power, Local Giving and Gentle Radical, Edible Cardiff, Cardiff Met, WMC, BBC, FAN, Cardiff University, Bevan Foundation.
