Professional Certificate of Education PCE PCET

is for students who have a Level 3 qualification and wish to further their experience in their subject area by teaching in the PCET or lifelong learning and skills sector.

PGCE PCET - Degree (or equivalent)
PCE PCET - Level 3 qualification

Preparing to Teach in Post Compulsory Education (PCET)

Do you need a teaching qualification to register with the EWC or are you looking to gain experience of *teaching adults / young people* in further education, higher education, alternative, adult & community education, then the Preparing to Teach in Post Compulsory Education (PCET) qualification is the right course for you.

This ten week short course is designed as an introduction to teach post-16 learners, offering a comprehensive teaching toolkit to build your confidence for teaching or delivering sessions.

What you will study

- The role of the teacher, trainer in post-16 education
- The ways in which personal motivation can impact upon learning
- Techniques and teaching methods that promote successful and inclusive learning
- How adults learn
- How to design, deliver, assess and evaluate a lesson

Entry requirements: A qualification at Level 3 (A Level or equivalent) in the subject you intend to teach.

Assessment: The course is a 10 credit Level 4 module equivalent to module one of the PGCE/PCE Post Compulsory Education and Training (PCET) programme which is assessed via coursework.
